Connecticut Transportation Updates

MAT Receives Loan

Middletown Area Transit received a \$965,339 state loan to assist in the clean up of soil at its future Pease Avenue maintenance facility. The funds are part of a \$10.5 million state loan and grant program which assists towns and cities in cleaning up contaminated soil. MAT will be building a 19,000 square-foot facility for bus and van storage and the maintenance of the fleet. The new facility will be named in memory of former administrator Thomas Cheeseman.

Annual Bus Rodeo

The Last Mile

CACT, Transit for Connecticut and the Partnership for Stronger Communities held a "The Last Mile: Housing, Transit and Access to Jobs: A Conversation with DOT Commissioner Jim Redeker" on Wednesday, May 22 at The Lyceum in Hartford. Commissioner Redeker provided an update on CTfastrak, citing it's a dedicated fixed route "shuttle service" with high service frequency like the New York subway. As Jim noted "You go to the subway stop to get somewhere...Buses don't take you everywhere, it takes you from point to point..." CTfastrak is accessible and bike friendly. Tom Maziarz from CONNDOT noted, it now takes a 45 minute bus ride from New Britain to Harford, and when CTfastrak is operating it will take 20 minutes, a significant reduction in travel time. CRCOG Executive Director Lyle Wray talked about "putting jobs near transit." CRCOG is sponsoring meetings with towns to discuss Transit Oriented Development and the myriad of opportunities to expand economic development and affordable housing. Newly appointed Housing Commissioner Evonne Klein is in the process of consolidating the housing agency and spoke about determining where is housing needed at different levels and the importance of placing housing near public transportation.

Commissioner Redeker said the DOT has a commitment to look at all transit issues and that transit and housing work based on accessibility.

AARP's Public Policy Institute recently did an analysis of the federal government's National Household Travel Study and notes that many citizens age 65+ have no access to public transportation, and 20% don't drive and yet the use of public transportation by older Americans has increased by 40% between 2001 and 2009. Clearly public transportation will need to respond to this trend as the older population increases.

Use Tax Dollars for Transportation

Mineta Transportation Institute (MTI) recently conducted a survey for the American Public Transportation Association that shows an increase in support of using tax dollars to improve public transportation by expanding and creating new transit options. Last year, 69% of respondents were in favor and this year 74% were. Also 80% surveyed believed investment in public transportation helped to create jobs and a stronger community. MAT provides Fixed Route, Rural Route, Paratransit/Dial-A-Ride, and Jobs Access and Reverse Commute (JARC) service to the towns of Middletown, Portland, East Hampton, Cromwell, Meriden, Middlefield and Durham. They have a fleet of 20 vehicles and 43 employees. Andy served in the United States Air Force for 20 years, retiring in 1990, and specializing in the field of Air Transportation. Stationed in Dover, Delaware; Panama; and Italy and he has been associated with MAT since 1992. He started as an Operations Manager with Red & Tan Tours and Coach USA, operating as a contractor to MAT in charge of the vehicle maintenance program, drivers (fixed route), and mechanics. In January 2007, MAT brought fixed route operations in-house. Andy became the Assistant Administrator April 2010 and the Administrator April 2011. MAT is currently constructing a \$10.4 million, 19,000 sq. ft. Maintenance & Storage Facility. Estimated completion date is June 2014. He has a B.S. degree in Human Resources Management through Wilmington College of Delaware and an A.A.S. degree in Logistics Management through the Community College of the Air Force. Andy was born and raised in Middletown and currently resides in the Westfield section of Middletown. He is married to Susan Chiaravallo (Petrie) and has two daughters and 6 grandchildren.
